



GUIDER BRINGS PHOTOGRAPHIC RIVER EXHIBIT TO RDC

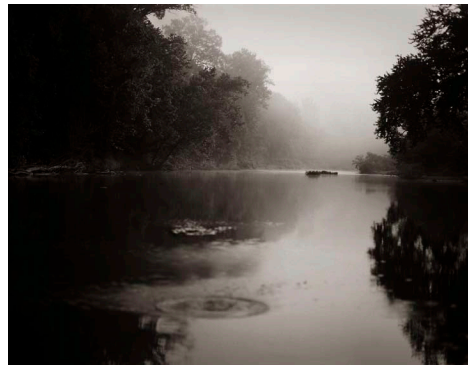
John Guider is a successful Nashville commercial photographer who decided he needed a challenge. He stepped away from the comfortable, predictable routine of his life, and with no camping or paddling experience, he bought a canoe and set off on an artistic adventure from the creek behind his farmhouse, to the Cumberland, the Ohio and eventually the Mississippi River all the way to New Orleans. The journey lasted 3 months,

but upon returning he realized he needed to finish the trip, and set off for the headwaters of the Mississippi at Lake Itasca, MN.

John's life changing journey brings us a stunning visual narration, *The River Inside*, with 70 platinum prints on display beginning November 30th through January 25th in the gallery at the back of the River Discovery Center.

to learn about our great asset, the river while having a great time! The kids will come in small groups throughout the school year. Thank you to the Propeller Club!



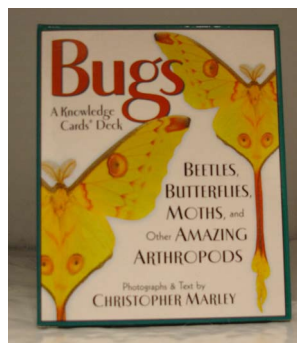

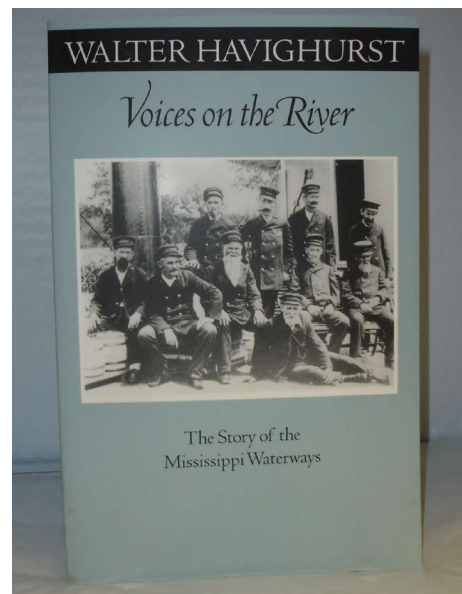
